Consequently, the need to settle my mother's affairs, ongoing financial support for my brother, and his wife compounded by unpaid leave to assist my father, who lives across the country, quickly drained my savings.

As a person living with mental and physical illness, access to quality healthcare and medication is crucial to survival. Without the assistance your organization provided, I would have had to choose between maintaining insurance benefits and refilling my prescriptions or eating to pay the rent and related expenses.
